What is the RRP Program?

- RRP= Renovation, Repair and Painting
- Federal regulatory program affecting contractors, property managers and others who disturb painted surfaces



- Includes pre-renovation education, training, certification and work practices
- State of North Carolina is also developing regulations (http://www.epi.state.nc/epi/lead/lhmp.html)

What is the RRP Program?

 Applies to houses, apartments, child occupied facilities such as schools and day care centers built **before 1978** Becomes Applicable in April 2010





What is a Renovatio

Broadly defined



- Any activity that disturbs painted surfaces
- Includes most repair, remodeling and maintenance activities
- Includes window replacement and component removal
- <6 ft² inside or 20 ft² outside



745.82 Applicability

- Rule applies to renovations in
- 1. Target housing

- Pre-1978 housing
- Excludes housing for elderly unless child <6 lives there
- Excludes 0-bedroom dwellings (living area not separate from sleeping area – dorm rooms, barracks, efficiency and studio apartments)
- 2. Child-occupied facilities
 - Pre-1978 buildings with children <6 present 3hrs/day, 6 hrs/week (2 different days), 60 hrs/year
 - Examples: day care centers, pre-schools, kindergarten classrooms

745.80 Purpose

- In target housing and child occupied facilities:
 - LBP hazard information provided to owners and occupants before renovations done
 - Individuals performing work have proper training
 - Renovators and firms obtain certification
 - Required work practices are followed





745.82 Applicab

- Exceptions:
- 1. Certified Inspector/Risk Assessor (free of LBP)
- 2. Emergencies (weather, fire, etc)
- 3. EBLs' (child poisoning, emergency)
- Signed Statement from Owner (less than action level or type of facility)
- 5. Not exempt from Cleaning Requirements





745.89 Firm Certification Certification



- Duties of Certified Firm (fee)
 - Must ensure individuals performing renovations are either certified renovators or have been trained by certified renovator
 - Renovations are performed with mandatory work practices
 - Pre-renovation activities have been performed
 - Recordkeeping/Disclosure requirements are met

745.90 Renovator certification and dust sampling certification

Duties of certified renovator

- Be physically present at work site when signs are posted, work area containment is being established, work area cleaning is performed
- Regularly direct work performed by uncertified persons
- Be available at all times (on site or by phone)
- Have initial and refresher certificates at work site
- Prepare required records

745.90 Renovator certification and dust sampling certification

Duties of certified renovator

Use acceptable test kits to determine if components contain LBP when requested by person contracting for renovation
Provide training to uncertified workers
Perform or direct uncertified workers who perform required work practices
Must perform post-renovation cleaning verification

Recognized Test





0.5% ------→ 3.0% Medium Lead Concentration Range (0.5% to 3.0% lead)



0.0% ------→ 0.3% Low Lead Concentration Range (0.0% to 0.3% lead)

745.84 Information Distribution

- Renovations in these facilities
 - Within 60 days of renovation
 - FIRM or Owner (if they hire a firm) give pamphlet and get written acknowledgement
 - Provide each parent or guardian with pamphlet and renovation information (if no response keep copies of certified mail - 7 mailing days before can start)
 - Post informational signs during renovation
 Prepare written statement

745.86 Recordkeeping and Reporting

- 3-year Record Retention Requirement
- Required records include:
 - Inspector report certifying LBP not present
 - Signed/dated acknowledgements of receipt of pamphlet
 - Certifications of attempted delivery of pamphlet
 - Records of notification attempts for common areas and child-occupied facilities
 - Signed/dated statements from owner saying work practices do not apply
 - No children, no pregnant women, not a COF
 - Written in same language as rental contract

745.85 Work Practices

Standards for Renovation Activities

 Must be performed by certified firms using certified renovators

Occupant Protection (Firms must...)

- Post signs to define work area and warn occupants/other persons to stay of work area
- Signs in same language as occupants
- Signs posted before beginning renovation and until post-renovation cleaning verification is completed

745.85 Work Practices

- Standards for Renovation Activities Containing the Work Area (Firms must...) Isolate work area before beginning renovation to contain dust/debris Maintain integrity of containment Ensure plastic is not torn or displaced 51 • Do not interfere with occupant/worker
 - emergency egress







745.85 Work Practices

- Prohibited and Restricted Practices
 - No open-flame burning/torching
 - Using machines with "high speed operations" such as sanding, grinding, power planing, needle gun, abrasive blasting, or sandblasting require HEPA exhaust control
 - Heat gun permitted only if operated <1100 degrees F
 - Must contain lead waste







745.225 Accreditation of training programs

- Enforced with Training April 2010
- Certified Renovator 8 hours with 2 hours hands-on
- Certified Dust Sampling Technician– 8 hours with 2 hours hands-on
- Must have photograph of individual
